CONGRESS OVERVIEW

The Australian facility management (FM) market is experiencing steady growth as organisations increasingly prioritise efficiency, sustainability, and digital transformation. The market reached USD 691.3 million in 2024 and is projected to grow to USD 1,303.4 million by 2033, representing a CAGR of 7.3% between 2025 and 2033. This growth is largely driven by the adoption of advanced technologies such as IoT, Artificial Intelligence (AI), and Building Information Modelling (BIM), which enable predictive maintenance, real-time monitoring, and improved operational efficiency. These innovations help reduce costs while enhancing system reliability and sustainability for commercial building owners and tenants.

Australia is also strengthening its research and environmental infrastructure through strategic investments. The CSIRO has announced a \$6.5 million investment in new analytical research facilities at its Waite Campus in Adelaide. These laboratories will enhance capabilities in environmental and groundwater analysis, supporting Australia's efforts to manage pollution, safeguard water security, and improve long-term environmental sustainability.

Meanwhile, large-scale defence and industrial investments are creating additional demand for sophisticated facility management services. Cushman & Wakefield recently secured a major facilities management contract with BAE Systems Australia to manage critical defence sites across the country. At the same time, Hanwha Defence Australia has invested approximately AUD 225 million in the Hanwha Armoured Vehicle Centre of Excellence, while the Australian government has committed A\$12 billion to upgrade shipyard facilities at the Henderson Defence Precinct under the AUKUS security partnership, further reinforcing the long-term demand for advanced facility management capabilities.
